

# How to use Roll It Recap for Revision!



Working in pairs or teams, take turns to roll the dice for a column and then again for a row.

Students place their answer on the grid if correct. The student with the most correct answers wins the game.

## Benefits:

- Each student gets a turn to speak or answer and are accountable to teammates for contributing if used as a class game.
- Practice respectful and focused listening.
- The more we review, the stronger we make the memory, the longer we can remember it.
- Social interaction activates the brain the most!
- It makes revision engaging and meaningful.
- The game can be adapted for all students needs and used at home as a family game.
