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This policy has been written in conjunction with the college's Equality and Diversity policy (Equality Act 2010)

We believe that students achieve the best in a purposeful and interesting learning environment. Teaching and Learning are of prime importance. The results of our surveys tell us that students' attitudes to education and the promotion of a structured learning environment are vital. School uniform supports the development of a positive approach to learning and differentiates learning time in college from home and the social environment. It also promotes a sense of identity and helps students to feel a sense of pride in their College.

Students transfer from a number of primary schools. It is important that they develop allegiance to Crown Hills and identify with the College ethos.

We are proud of the multi-cultural and inclusive nature of Crown Hills and celebrate our cultural diversity.

We ensure that our uniform respects religious and cultural dress.

The College principles on uniform

- School uniform is intended to be smart, comfortable and free from fashion extremes
- School uniform is also worn to help identification and to create a more secure establishment
- The Principal's/Governors' decision on suitable items will be final
- The College will adopt a rigorous set of procedures and sanctions to maintain standards of school uniform and will enforce these standards consistently
- The College will ensure that uniform items are of good quality and value



All students must wear:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Black trousers – plain cut and full length: No jeans, combats, shorts or cut off trousers • Plain white cotton shirt with collar. Shirts should be tucked in' • College black blazer with gold piping to the lapels with the college logo on the breast pocket' • College tie- This must be worn at all times whilst in and around the College building • Plain black belts- No fashion belts. <p>RELIGIOUS DRESS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain black jubbah with high collar (Daffa/Al-Aseel) • Ties are not required if wearing religious dress • Black Topee 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Black trousers – plain cut and full length: No jeans, leggings, jeggings or cut off trousers • Black skirt (knee length or longer): No fashion skirts: Skirts should not be worn over leggings. • Plain white cotton shirt with collar. Shirts should be tucked in or fitted. • College black blazer with gold piping to the lapels with the college logo on the breast pocket. • Plain black belts- No fashion belts. • OPTIONAL – College tie or College neck scarf <p>RELIGIOUS DRESS</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain black Abaya/Jilbab (with narrow sleeves) • Black Hijab if required
<p>Students may wear a black college sweater with the college logo under their blazer. These can be purchased from the uniform suppliers. Students should not wear any other black sweater.</p>	
<p>Students must wear the College blazer at all times whilst in and around the college buildings.</p> <p>Students who wear a Leadership shirt must wear a blazer at all times.</p>	
<p>Shoes should be: formal, black upper, black sole, Closed toes, low-heeled, lace up, slip on or strap options. They should be made of polishable or patent leather type material. No ballet shoes/canvas/trainers/sports logos or trim.</p>	
<p>One outdoor coat - must be plain and reasonably waterproof. No decoration or large logos are permitted. Leather or denim jackets and 'fashion coats' are not allowed. (Coloured sweaters and 'hoodies' are NOT outdoor coats.)</p> <p>Outdoor coats, scarves, hats and gloves must not be worn in the college building.</p>	
<p>Students must wear their identity badge visibly on a lanyard around their neck at all times unless directed by a member of staff. The ID must not be defaced</p> <p>On health and safety grounds, all staff and students must be identifiable at all times.</p>	



Hair	Hair must be a natural colour and of a moderate style.
Accessories	One small stud or sleeper in each ear and/or one small nose stud is allowed. No other facial piercing is permitted. No fashion accessories are allowed. Headphones should not be worn in the building.
Make-up	Should students choose to wear make-up, it should be light and not excessive. Any concerns regarding make-up will be discussed with parents.
School Bag and equipment	All students must have a suitable bag in which to carry books and equipment. This bag must be large enough to hold at least one A4 folder. No man bags or handbags. Students must have the basic equipment for learning. i.e. Pens, pencils, ruler, rubber and pencil sharpener. Students should have their planner with them throughout the day as well as any subject specific equipment.
PE Kit	Students should enter and leave the College in full uniform. PE and Dance kit is for lesson time only and should be carried in a bag.
Student Identity Badges	ID badges are needed to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hold food hall credits • Collect rewards • Gain access to the college building at break or lunchtime • Enter the library • Attend lunchtime clubs • Print work <p>Cards must be topped up at the cash loaders before queuing for the food hall. Cards can be topped up for printing at the machine outside reprographics.</p>
Students not complying with uniform requirements will be monitored, recorded and challenged to meet our expectations.
